
BYLAW No. 07-2009


A BYLAW TO PROHIBIT OBSTRUCTIONS ADJACENT TO CERTAIN ROAD ALLOWANCES

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Snipe Lake No. 259, in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts the following:


1. For the purpose of this bylaw the expression:
 - a. "Municipality" means the Rural Municipality of Snipe Lake No. 259
 - b. "Road" means any road allowance within the municipality other than:
 - i. A private road; or
 - ii. A provincial highways; or
 - iii. A road or highway within the following hamlets to wit:
 1. Hamlet of Isham
 2. Hamlet of Richlea
 3. Hamlet of Snipe Lake all in the Province of Saskatchewan
 - c. "Other object" does not include fence lines.
2. No person shall hereafter plant trees or shrubs or place stones, earth or gravel pits, portable structures, machinery or other objects on private property within:
 - a. Ninety (90) metres/ Three hundred (300) feet from the intersection of the center line of any municipal road,
 - b. Forty-six (46) metres/ One hundred and fifty (150) feet from the centerline of any municipal road.
3. The council may, by order, direct the owner of any private property upon which a tree or shrub has been planted, or stone, earth or gravel pile, portable structure, machinery or other object has been placed in contravention of the provisions of Section 2 hereof, to remove the same within a time stated in such order and the provisions of Section 8 of *The Municipalities Act*, shall apply, mutates mutandis, if the owner fails to comply with the order.
4. For the purpose of fence lines:
 - a. Fence lines may be constructed anywhere on private land, so long as it is on private owner boundaries.
 - b. No person shall hereafter construct a fence on any municipal right of ways.
5. Any person who contravenes the provision of Section 2 and 4, hereof, is guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to the penalties imposed in the general penalty bylaw of the municipality.
6. Bylaw No. 06- 1991 and Bylaw No. 07- 1991 is hereby repealed.
